



ARISTRIAL GARDEN @GREEN LEAF PLANTS SUMMARY OF KEY FINDINGS 2023



Trial Garden Key Facts

- Comprises one acre in a Zone 6b environment
 - □ Public garden ¾ acre (21 beds)
 - ☐ Private garden ¼ acre (6 beds)
- Public Garden:
 - ☐ 74 genera
 - ☐ 535 varieties
 - □ 32 Breeders represented
 - ☐ 60% sponsored trials
 - □ Remaining varieties are for comparison purposes
 - □ 50/50 1st and 2nd year planting
- Private Garden
 - 50 genera
 - 215 varieties
- All varieties are given a QR code for evaluation purposes

Caveats



Garden was rebuilt in 2022 so only 1st and 2nd year results are available

- No pesticides are applied in the garden. The exception being the Dendranthema breeding bed, which is not part of the trials.
 - Due to an infestation of Japanese beetles, we did use traps this season
- Overhead irrigation is used as needed; once established, plants are watered only if there has been no rain for roughly one week
- Though Zone 6b, we can have a Zone 6 or a Zone 7 winter
- Deer are not a factor, though rabbits are and at times we will spray a pest deterrent on susceptible plants



These data represent the results of our garden in Lancaster, PA and are not necessarily indicative of other areas of the country:

Clay soil leads to poor drainage and some varieties don't do well

Weather conditions:

- Winter 2022-23 had no snowfall
- Early spring warm-up followed by dropping temperatures
- Near drought conditions through early June 2023
- 'Feast or Famine' rainfall throughout July and August

Trial Garden Evaluation Process

PUBLIC GARDEN EVALUATIONS CONSIST OF:

Two-three full ratings per season (with photos):

- ✓ Overall
- √ Foliage
- ✓ Habit/Uniformity
- ✓ Flower (if applicable)

Periodic check-ins (with photos):

- ✓ Photos
- ✓ Overall Status
- ✓ Size/width
- ✓ Bloom status
- √etc.

On average each variety receives 4-6 ratings per season

Spring survival rates are also noted for final ratings



8/9/23: Very solid re-bloom with the number of buds coming up and again a really nice great rounded habit.







AB Cultivars



RUDBECKIA Divine AB Cultivars

Pros:

- Two of the most popular varieties in the garden
- RUDBECKIA 1
 - Flowers transition from pale yellow to rose-yellow as they mature
 - Long bloom time with repeat budding
- RUDBECKIA 2
 - Nearly perfect habit and consistency
 - Large (~5" diameter) flowers on long stems
 - Extremely floriferous

Cons:

- Biennial hirta
- Not yet released; will be available 2024



ECHINACEA hybrid Double Scoop™ Watermelon Deluxe Darwin Perennials®

Pros:

- Outstanding color with contrasting stems
- Extremely floriferous
- Compact habit

Cons:

• No second-year trial, as of yet



VERONICA 'Seaside' GardenChoice™

Pros:

- Elegant lavender-blue flower spikes on tall, sturdy stems
- Attracts pollinators
- Long-bloom time
- Responds well to a cut

Cons:

- Somewhat prone to mildew by end of season
- Deer resistance claimed but cannot be confirmed in our garden



AGASTACHE 'Crazy Fortune'
Concept Plants

Pros:

- Lightly variegated leaves
- Slightly smaller habit than Blue Fortune

Cons:

- Some (minor) signs of reversion on new leaves
- Flowers somewhat smaller than Blue Fortune

Top Performer:

- "Attracts loads of pollinators, resistant to insect damage, has beautiful foliage, and exceptional habit"
- "Gorgeous basil, one of the healthiest, best performing first year plants in the garden"



OCIMUM basilicum
'Citriodorum' (Pesto Perpetuo)

Above Average:

- "Unique grow pattern on these where the foliage grows up around the flower"
- "Healthy plant. Attractive foliage. Unique foliage. Upright habit"

Fair:

"This one is said to be resistant to mildew, which we can't say for sure it is, but it is susceptible to Japanese beetles"

Very Good: "Foliage is attractive and unique, would make a good container plant or ground cover"

Good: "One plant is in poor

health, but the others have a

definitely attracting a lot of pollinators."

Not everything thrives in clay soil.....



Fair/Poor:

- "Struggled all season with clay soil conditions."
- "Similar to the other SALVIAs in the herb bed, health is not strong"
- "Foliage was originally good but is now declining in health"
